WHEREAS: Nightbird Books provided a venue for reading events featuring local and regional authors, book signings, and even some occasional music performances, and


WHEREAS: we honor Nightbird Books 14 years in business in Fayetteville and Lisa's passion for books, her employees, her customers and her community.
